From our School of Nursing to our graphic design program, our academic units continue to be ranked and recognized as the top programs not only in the state but also in the country. Over 21% of UTC students are first-generation college students, and our campus was officially designated as a military-friendly school in 2022.

Built in 1957, the renovation of Hunter Hall is complete, and work is underway on the \$30 million dollar Wolford Family Athletics Complex and McKenzie Arena renovation. With future projects on the horizon including a new Nursing Building, renovations to Brock Hall, a \$40 million dollar upgrade at 540 McCallie – the former state office building – and an expansion of the Gary W. Rollins College of Business, it is an exciting time to be at UTC.

Last fiscal year, the UC Foundation with the support of stakeholders and the endowment provided over **\$2.7 million dollars of private scholarship support to 1,410 students.** In addition, our endowment holds nearly 350 fully endowed funds that support professors, academic programs and scholarship opportunities across our campus.

In this annual report featuring highlights from students, faculty and campus, we hope you will join us in celebrating the impact of philanthropy and the life changing work happening at the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga.

## **UC FOUNDATION**ENDOWMENT NUMBERS



## **Dr. Kristi Wick**

Vicky B. Gregg Chair in Gerontology

With a focus to advance nursing science and leadership, along with shaping policy related to the care of older adults and their caregivers, Dr. Kristi Wick's strategic approach to the field of gerontology empowers older adults to age with dignity. Dr. Wick focuses on curriculum, workforce development, research and best practices to improve older adult health and quality of care outcomes across all health care sectors.

Along with her colleagues, Dr. Wick has received over \$1.5 million in grant funding to support the development of Dementia Friendly Communities in Tennessee, leading to the establishment of the EngAGING Communities Tennessee initiative which serves as a broad umbrella for case management, workforce support, interprofessional collaboration and research statewide.

Recognizing that innovative change requires strong collaborative relationships between health professionals and the community, Dr. Wick leverages community resources to implement programs which address health disparities in our most vulnerable populations. For instance, during the COVID-19 pandemic, Dr. Wick arranged pop-up onsite COVID-19 testing and vaccine clinics for older adults in congregate housing across Hamilton County with help from UTC faculty, students, local organizations and volunteers.



#### ABOUT THE ROLLINS SCHOLARS PROGRAM

Made possible as part of a generous \$40 million gift from UTC College of Business alumnus Mr. Gary W. Rollins and his wife, Kathleen Rollins, in July 2018, the Rollins Scholars program provides up to 20 outstanding incoming freshmen students with a \$4,000 annual scholarship for up to four consecutive years of study. In addition to scholarship support, Rollins Scholars attend core classes together, live in the same residence hall and participate in hands-on, educational experiences outside the classroom.

## **Dr. Mina Sartipi**

Guerry Professor, Computer Science and Engineering



Dr. Mina Sartipi is the Founding Director of the Center for Urban Informatics and Progress while also a Guerry Professor in the Computer Science and Engineering Department. Awarded the Guerry Professorship in 2020, Dr. Sartipi was able to expand her research activities, especially those related to community engagement and collaboration with municipalities.

The Guerry Professorship enables Dr. Sartipi to focus on the urban testbed project – a 1.2 mile stretch of MLK Boulevard in downtown Chattanooga outfitted with a variety of sensors, cameras and networking capabilities that gather unprecedented real-time data from vehicles, pedestrians and other modes of transportation through the corridor. This testbed resulted in Chattanooga receiving a \$4.5 million federal grant from the U.S. Department of Transportation to expand the testbed's footprint and number of projects including establishing the largest electric vehicle living testbed in the nation.

In addition to advising more students and overseeing the largest federal DOT grant in UTC history, the Guerry Professorship has increased Dr. Sartipi and her team's ability to conduct, publish and present original research including five papers at the Transportation Research Board, which is the largest transportation conference in the country.
