The Challenge and Opportunity

While access to quality healthcare is essential, we face a lack of skilled healthcare workers in all disciplines to meet the need. For more than a decade, the United States has experienced a severe nursing shortage which will only increase as more nurses reach retirement age. The COVID-19 pandemic exacerbated the issue causing a mass exodus of bedside clinical nurses. The unrelenting heavy demands placed on nurses in recent years have led many to retire early, scale back to part-time work, practice in a different setting or pursue a different career.

Worldwide, nurses are at the forefront of health and wellness. It is nurses' empathy, advocacy and trustworthiness, though, that cement lasting relationships with patients and their families. We have the ability to provide better care for every citizen in the Chattanooga community and surrounding areas. **We can empower nurse leaders who will make critical decisions and save lives. 

Building Highlights

UTC has a mission and responsibility to serve the greater Chattanooga community. The UTC Nursing Building will be a hub for healthcare innovation and education, which will support students and advance community health by addressing specific gaps in care. A medically underserved community, Chattanooga requires an increase of 27% more healthcare providers by 2024 to meet demand. The building will allow UTC to produce a steady pipeline of nursing graduates to employ and help the college meet regional workforce needs.



Financials

The State of Tennessee has recognized the critical need to expand the healthcare workforce and has allocated \$56 million toward the new facility. The University must raise \$21 million to fully fund the construction.
